Did you know... APRS is supported on UHF Too?

(In most of Arizona, at least)

As you may know, most APRS (Automatic Packet Reporting System) activity is on the VHF band, specifically 144.390 Mhz. Anyone that has monitored this frequency knows that it is usually very busy with packet traffic and collisions are numerous.

What you may not know is that APRS is also supported on the UHF band, unfortunately there is no universal frequency on UHF like there is on VHF.

In Arizona the frequency to use is 445.925 Mhz. Most of Arizona is now covered with the addition of a new digipeater and Igate in the Tucson area.

For the most part UHF APRS is fairly quite, very few users are currently using it. However if you just use APRS for tracking, or have someone following you online, there is no noticeable difference compared to VHF.

You might consider UHF next time you are playing with APRS.

Repeater News...

Nothing to report is great news on the repeater front. Nothing is broken or having problems at this time.

CRC/RST ran as a 4A, low power plus GOTA operation. Station power was provide by solar charged batteries or vehicle charged batteries, one operator idled his truck the entire 24 hours! Generators were banned due to fire restrictions. Only one of the stations actually ran at a full 100W. Two only operated at 30-50W and the 20M CW station ran strict 5W QRP on a Drake TR7! Not the most efficient QRP rig out there. Fun was had by all!
