Planes, Trains, and Automobiles, oh my!

Are you a pilot or airplane freak? If so this is for you!

www.flightradar24.com is a website that tracks airplanes worldwide using data from a number of sources, including ADS-B and MLAT data collected by enthusiasts like yourself using SDR dongles or other receivers and feeding it to Flightradar24 servers. The bonus is that as long as you feed data to flightradar24 you get a Premium account on the website for FREE!

On Flightradar24 you can see and track information like speed, altitude, path, aircraft type, and much more. You can also get a computer generated, using satellite imagery, 3D view out the cockpit windows! For commercial flights you can see airline data such as time of departure, arrival time, departure airport, destination airport, etc... See if your flight has been delayed in realtime!

Ok, now you're asking 'What in the Samhill does this have to do with Amateur radio?!?' Glad you asked.

You may have seen the same SDR dongles in QST or elsewhere used to receive analog and digital transmissions from HF to 2.4Ghz and above. These transmissions include DMR, P25, D-STAR, LSB/USB, CW, basically any mode you can think of. The same \$20 SDR dongles can be used to receive ADS-B, and modeS-transponder data used in MLAT to feed data to the Flightradar24 servers and get you that free account.

ADS-B is a newer transponder technology that transmits the aircrafts GPS position and more. MLAT uses the older modeS-transponder data from four or more receivers to triangulate the aircrafts position. Both types use 1090Mhz to transmit (squawk) the data.
