Hi, my name is Sitka. I am 11 years old, and live on the east side of Tucson. My call sign is KG7ZXB. I have been a ham since December 2015. I was introduced to ham radio through the Vail Vaqueros 4-H club. I thought that it sounded

interesting so I signed up for the ham radio project after the leader, Miss Lani, had spoken about what ham radio was all about. I have been participating in 4-H for 2 years now and my 3rd year is starting soon. This year, I plan on being involved in archery, cake decorating and ham radio.

The ham radio project had a chance to contact the International Space Station and talk to American astronaut, Kjell Lindgren in August of 2015. It was a once in a lifetime experience and got me motivated to study for my ham radio license. Last year the main focus of the ham radio project was on learning Morse code and we will continue to work on that this coming year.

I have entered a ham radio project each year at the Pima County Fair. In 2015, I built a transceiver with Jerico and in 2016. I built a Morse code straight key. Ham radio has been my best scoring event in the fair. Jerico and I earned a blue ribbon for the transceiver we built and I earned a purple ribbon for my presentation on the Morse code keyer.

I have started my own ham shack in a corner of our garage. I have a J-pole antenna, which Mr. Joe helped me build, up at the side of the house. It can be connected to my handheld, the AM/SSB receiver or the dual band FM transceiver I have. Thankfully, I haven't had to pay for any of this equipment, as I have either earned it or it has been given to me as a gift.

Other than ham radio, I enjoy reading, drawing, sewing, knitting, swimming and studying history and nature. This summer my family has been visiting a lot of the national parks and monuments in Arizona. We have now visited at least half of the parks in Arizona. My favorite was Hubbell Trading Post because it is still a traditional trading post and has not been turned into a convenience store. Also, I found out that Lorenzo Hubbell, the founder of Hubbell Trading Post, is a cousin of Edwin Hubble, even though their last names are spelled differently.

I enjoy being a part of the ham radio community in Arizona and I hope that other young kids earn their license too.




