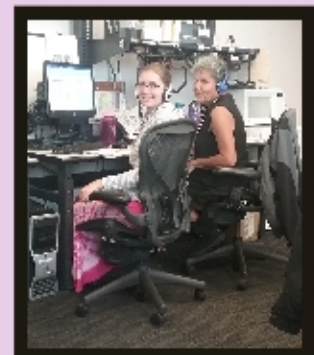
Angie Buchanan – N7EMB – Ham Of The Year **Annika Smith – KE7JOY – Young Ham Of The Year**

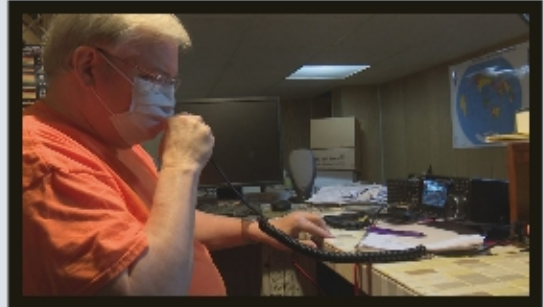

Amateur Radio Operators Use Old Tech For Worldwide Communications During Pandemic

PEORIA (WEEK) -- While video chatting apps like Zoom are rising in popularity, a group of local people are using a slightly older technology to stay in touch.



The hobby of amateur radio -- better known as ham radio -- allows people like Jon Dainty and Thomas Hunt to talk with each other and others without having to leave their “shacks” -- coming naturally during the COVID-19 pandemic and Governor Pritzker’s stay-at-home order.

Both members of the Peoria-Area Amateur Radio Club, they can talk over different frequencies based on class of license.

Both Dainty and Hunt hold “extra” class licenses -- the highest class -- giving them the ability to talk around the world using HF depending on solar weather conditions.

“...One in Hungary, and one in England, and one in Croatia, as well as hams locally in the U.S.,” said Thomas Hunt, trustee at the Peoria Area Amateur Radio Club. “Course, all of us are talking about the COVID-19 virus which we found we have more in common with those who are sheltering-in-place all over the world as we do here in the United States.”

Many amateurs are also trained weather spotters -- watching for severe weather and reporting back to the national weather service.

The day of the Washington tornado, amateur radio operators were the first line of communications until cell phones came back.

Hunt says amateurs continue training for disaster communications.

Radio Amateurs Help Air Ambulance

Peru's Radio Club Peruano (RCP) reports that Guillermo Guerra, OA4DTU/XQ3SA, and the Peruvian Relief Net assisted an air ambulance en route to Easter Island on July 9 after its satellite communication equipment failed. The aircraft was about 1,000 nautical miles from the continent, so the pilot tuned to the Peruvian Relief Net on 7100 kHz.



Net control station OA4DTU and Giancarlo Passalacqua, OA4DSN, were still on frequency, and communication was established with the aircraft. The pilot detailed its tenuous connection and requested support to communicate via telephone with Ocean Air Control, a service of the Directorate General of Aeronautics of Chile, which watches over 32 million square kilometers of air space off the Chilean coast in the Pacific.

Authorities were already on alert for the aircraft because of the communication loss, plus the HF at the Easter Island tower was inoperative. About 10 phone calls were made to point out the aircraft's position and route schedule, as well as any additional information needed. Other hams in Peru were listening in and standing by.

Guerra remained in contact with the aircraft until he was sure that it would reach its destination. At approximately 2330 UTC, the pilot reported making VHF contact with the Easter Island control tower for landing instructions. — Thanks to Radio Club Peruano

Field Day 2020 is Shaping Up to be One for the Record Books

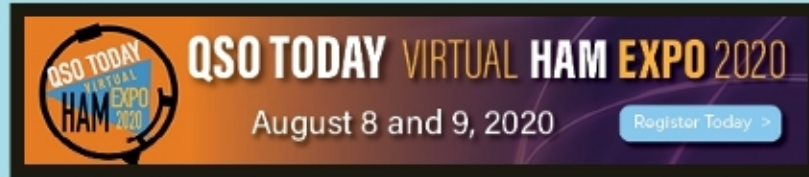

ARRL Contest Program Manager Paul Bourque, N1SFE, reported that ARRL has received more than 8,700 online Field Day entries by mid-week, and paper-only entries have started arriving too.

“As many participants chose to operate from home this year — and given the 2020 rules waivers, we have seen a tremendous increase in entries over last year's event,” Bourque said. “Most of the entries received have been through the online web app, and Headquarters staffers have begun processing the paper entries this week. The 2020 waivers allowed individual club members to attribute their scores to their clubs.



Participants who submitted entries online are encouraged to check the Field Day entries received page to verify that their entries are marked as complete, and that the club name entered is correct. Entries with a status of “pending” are incomplete entries that are missing one or more items, and these need to be completed for an official entry. Share your stories and photos using the ARRL soapbox or via social media, such as on the ARRL Field Day Facebook group.

Due to the health and welfare of our amateur ham radio community, all events have been cancelled or postponed, until further notice, due to the current pandemic we are all experiencing!

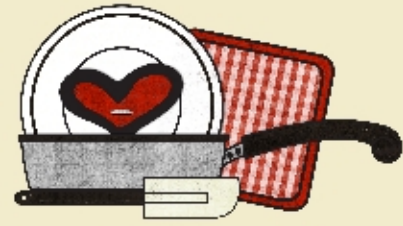

Salsa Verde Chicken Casserole



*Prep/Total Time: 30 min.
Makes 6 Servings*

Ingredients

2 cups shredded rotisserie chicken
1 cup sour cream
1-1/2 cups salsa verde, divided
8 corn tortillas (6 inches)
2 cups chopped tomatoes
1/4 cup minced fresh cilantro
2 cups shredded Monterey Jack cheese
Optional toppings: Avocado slices,
thinly sliced green onions or fresh
cilantro leaves

Test Kitchen Tips

**Some like it hot! Add sliced jalapenos to kick the flavor up a notch.*

**When substituting canned tomatoes for fresh, drain them first so you don't end up with soup.*

**Flour tortillas also work well.*

**Leftovers make a hearty breakfast. Serve with a fried or poached egg.*

Directions

1. In a small bowl, combine the chicken, sour cream and 3/4 cup salsa. Spread 1/4 cup salsa on the bottom of a greased 8-in. square baking dish.
2. Layer with half of the tortillas and chicken mixture; sprinkle with half the tomatoes, minced cilantro and half of the cheese. Repeat layers with remaining tortillas, chicken mixture, tomatoes and cheese.
3. Bake, uncovered, at 400° until bubbly, 20-25 minutes. Serve with remaining salsa and, if desired, optional toppings.
