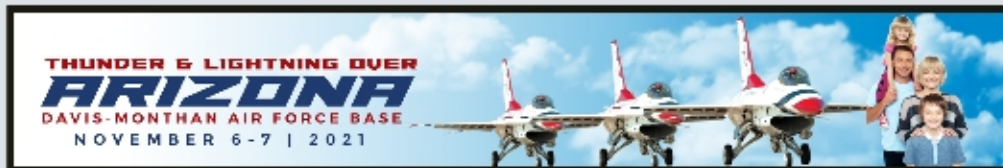

California Club Assists Animal Rescue Group with Communication Support

ARRL - 09/13/2021

The El Dorado County Amateur Radio Club (EDCARC) has been providing radio communication support for small and large-animal rescue efforts during the Caldor Fire. Members of the South County Large Animal Rescue (SCLAR) group, El Dorado County Animal Services, and other volunteers have been addressing the need. Many of the EDCARC volunteers are also members of the Club's Neighborhood Radio Watch program.

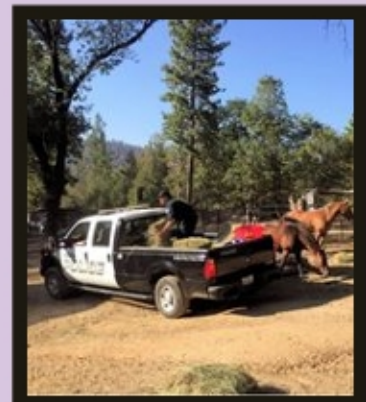
As the Caldor Fire destroyed the community of Grizzly Flats, threatened Lake Tahoe, and caused evacuations in dozens of communities throughout the county, thousands of area residents were forced to flee their homes without having time to round up their pets and livestock.

"We desperately love our animal companions, whether big or small, and being separated and unable to care for them in the midst of a disaster is truly heart-wrenching," said Alan Thompson, W6WN, the club's Public Information Officer. "Because of the mountainous terrain, many of our neighborhoods already had little or no cell or internet communication, and the fire only made things worse."

Thompson said the club quickly deployed its Mobile ARES Communications Center, maintained by Jay Harmor, KE6GLA, which is in service as central net operations. Several members stepped up, including Dale Dennis, KJ6HHY, from Yolo ARES, and Tom Newman, NN6H, from Alameda County RACES (and part of the Alameda County Sheriff's Communications Team, to volunteer their time and radios to accompany the animal rescue teams dispatched into impacted areas. Teams of SCLAR members, Animal Services personnel, public employees, and radio communications staff have been conducting daily animal rescue missions and welfare checks throughout the impacted areas. Until residents are permitted to return, these teams are providing food, water, and care to abandoned animals.

Thompson said those seeking an animal evacuation or welfare check should contact El Dorado County Animal Services — western slope, (530) 621-5795 or the shelter at (530) 621-7631. In the South Tahoe area, call (530) 573-7925.

SCLAR will respond as directed by El Dorado County Animal Services. They cannot self-deploy or respond directly to phone calls for assistance, Thompson said.

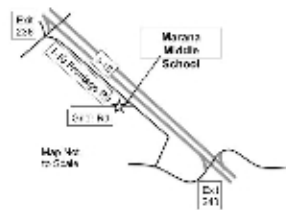

RST and Joe, K3TYE, will be conducting a Technician to General class starting on Thursday, January 6th, 2022. The evening classes will be held at Immanuel Presbyterian Church, 9252 East 22nd Street, starting at 6:30 PM sharp and lasting until 8:30 PM. The study guide we will be using is the "ARRL General Class License Manual, 9th Edition". This is a college level course. You will be assigned 2 or 3 chapters to read and understand each week and one or two subject categories from the General question pool 2019.

This is not just a "question and answer" class where we go over the questions in the FCC question pool. On Thursday evenings we will be covering the technical portions of the General Class exam in the classroom with "hands-on" and other type demonstrations including the use of test equipment. On another evening during the week we will be covering the administration and legal type questions "over-the-air". We will use one of the local repeaters (or perhaps two-meter simplex) to conduct an additional live, on-the-air class.

There is a prerequisite for attending this class. The participant must have a Technician Class license, a 2-meter transceiver, and have the capability to access local repeaters such as the 147.000 repeater located at 5151 East Broadway. [147.000 / 147.600 110.9 PL]

Even though Immanuel Presbyterian Church and Boy Scout Troop 157 are furnishing the classroom space, there is a \$30 charge to cover the church costs. I have the church reserved for Thursday nights from January 6th through February 25th. The \$30 fee goes to the church. (Disclaimer: I am not a member of Immanuel Presbyterian.)

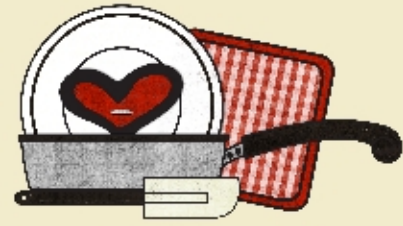

Cooking up
Some Magic



Steak Pot Pie

INGREDIENTS

2 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil, divided
1 1/2 lb. sirloin steak (about 3 steaks)
Kosher salt
Freshly ground black pepper
1 medium yellow onion, chopped
2 large carrots, peeled and chopped
2 celery stalks, chopped
2 russet potatoes, peeled and diced into 1/2" cubes
2 cloves garlic, minced
2 tsp. fresh thyme leaves
3 tbsp. all-purpose flour
2 c. low-sodium beef broth
2 tbsp. heavy cream
1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
1 c. frozen peas
1 (8-oz.) tube refrigerated Crescent dough
3 tbsp. melted butter



*YIELDS: 6 SERVINGS
PREP TIME: 0 HOURS 20 MINS
TOTAL TIME: 1 HOUR 20 MINS*

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a large oven-safe skillet over medium heat, heat 1 tablespoon oil. Add steak and sear on both sides, about 3 minutes per side. Season with salt and pepper. Remove from skillet and let rest 5 minutes before cutting into 1/2" cubes.
2. To skillet, heat remaining tablespoon oil. Add onion, carrots, and celery and cook until soft, 5 minutes. Add potatoes and cook 5 minutes more. Add garlic and thyme and cook until fragrant, 1 minute.
3. Add flour and stir to coat everything evenly. Slowly add broth, heavy cream, and worcestershire. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer 5 minutes, until slightly thickened. Add steak and peas to pan. Remove from heat.
4. Unroll crescents and arrange in a circle around the outer circle of the skillet, stretching to fit as necessary. Brush with melted butter.
5. Bake until crescents are golden and inside is bubbly, about 25 to 30 minutes.
