During Hurricanes, Emergency Officials Turn To Ham Radio

VERO BEACH, Fla. — Operators of amateur radios, also known as ham radios, play a vital role in the gathering of information during hurricanes like Irma.

“We take for granted our communications,” said Etta LoPresti, emergency management coordinator for Indian River County.

“But when you have something catastrophic like they do in the Keys and in the west coast of Florida, where you’re not going to have communication, these amateur radio operators take care of things for us.”

In Indian River County, Paul Bartoszewicz and Willie Thompson work 14-hour shifts during Hurricane Irma. They’re part of the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) — a group of licensed radio operators who help with communication during storms.

They work in a small room off the main area inside Indian River County’s Emergency Operation Center.

Bartoszewicz, 66, and Thompson, 61, do hourly calls to fellow amateur radio operators at each of the shelters in Indian River County.

“Are there communications such as land lines? Are they still up and running? Is their electrical up and running or down?, ” Bartoszewicz said. “Then we notify either FPL (Florida Power & Light) or City of Vero Beach because we have to get these shelters back up online. They all have generators; sometimes the generators fail.”

Irma is Bartoszewicz’ second hurricane since moving to Vero Beach six years ago. He also worked during Matthew last year.

Thompson moved to Vero Beach in 2004 — just in time for hurricanes Frances and Jeanne.

“I started (amatuer radio) way back in the day,” he said. “I enjoyed the hobby and then I started doing emergency communications. When I was in the army I was able to travel a lot and got to work in Texas with ARES there and then Oklahoma, so I got tornado experience and then I got hurricane experience here.”

The hours are challenging — 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. — but Bartoszewicz and Thompson feel a special responsibility for people in shelters.

“(The days are) long,” Bartoszewicz said. “But it’s rewarding to the fact that we are in charge of over 1,200 clients at our shelters that are located here.”

QCWA Honors William Orr, W8NPU, with its 80th Anniversary Award

The Quarter Century Wireless Association (QCWA) has honored centenarian and ARRL member William (Bill) Orr, W8NPU, of Columbus, Ohio, with its 80th Anniversary Award. QCWA member Don Fuhr, K8KSM, presented Orr with the framed award certificate. Orr has been licensed for **82 years**. While he is no relation to the Bill Orr, W6SAI, his story nonetheless is an interesting one.



According to the QCWA, Orr earned his commercial 2nd class radiotelephone license at age 18 in 1935 and began a lengthy career in radio and television broadcast engineering. On the basis of his success in obtaining the 2nd class commercial ticket, he also was granted a Class A Amateur Radio license. Orr previously held WA6NKM. The QCWA award presentation took place at Orr's home, which he shares with his wife, Mary. — Thanks to Ken Oelke, VE6AFO/QCWA

JOTA 2017 Organizers Urge Scout Stations to Register Now

Scouting's Jamboree on the Air/Jamboree on the Internet (JOTA/JOTI) event takes place over the October 20 - 22 weekend, and organizers are urging Scout stations planning to participate to register now. The world JOTA-JOTI Team has activated its online sign-up system. This year's event will be the 60th Jamboree on the Air.

"Our number one message at this time is to register their station and get ready for JOTA," JOTA Coordinator Jim Wilson, K5ND, told ARRL. "It's time for Scout groups to bring together their open action items — ordering patches, printing handouts, gathering equipment, reminding staff members, verifying location, and getting the word out to the Scouts to be prepared for a fabulous experience talking with other Scouts across the country and hopefully around the world."

JOTA is the world's largest Scouting event, held annually over the third full weekend in October, and Scouts of any age can participate — from Cub Scouts to Boy Scouts and Venturers, male and female. During JOTA, Amateur Radio links Scouts with other Scouts and hams, locally and worldwide. Since the first JOTA in 1958, millions of Scouts have met each other through this event to exchange ideas and share experiences via ham radio. Many contacts made during JOTA have resulted in enduring friendships and connections.

According to the World Scout Bureau, the 2016 JOTA had nearly 1.3 million Scout participants from more than 30,000 locations, and reached 156 countries.

The World JOTA-JOTI Team has published a Participant's Guide to help Scouts to get on the air and the Internet for the largest Scouting event in the world. They've also published a brief history of the 60 years of Jamboree on the Air as well as the Top 10 Challenges and Activities in 2016 that might provide ideas for your event this year. An online scheduling tool is available too.

For participating via EchoLink, two conference nodes now have been designated for Scout contacts — *JOTA-365* (node 480809) and *JAMBO* (node 832996). Visit the K2BSA Radio Scouting page for more information on frequencies, including D-STAR, DMR, and IRLP.

There was great people, great food and great cooks. The steaks were excellent and the sides that people brought, were excellent also. I'm thinking most food brought was consumed.

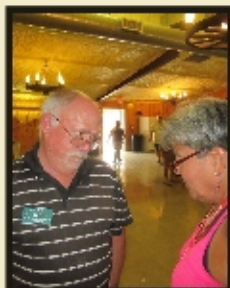
It's always great to put faces to calls. This year, a few new faces appeared and it's great meeting those who you talk to on a regular basis.

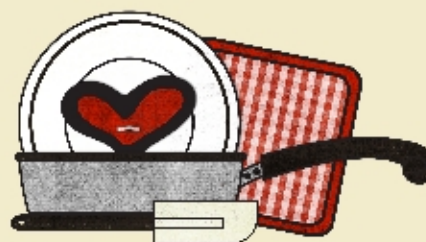

Cooking up
Some Magic



Pumpkin Cheesecake Brownies

Ingredients



Pumpkin Cheesecake:

4 oz cream cheese, softened
1/2 cup canned pumpkin
1 egg
3 tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

Brownies:

2/3 cup flour
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon cinnamon
4 ounces unsweetened chocolate,
chopped
1/2 cup butter
1 1/4 cups sugar
2 large eggs
1 teaspoon vanilla

Directions

To make the Pumpkin Cheesecake Layer: Beat together cream cheese, pumpkin, egg, sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg until smooth and creamy. Set aside.

To make the brownies: Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Line an 8x8 inch pan with foil and spray with cooking spray. In a large mixing bowl combine flour, baking powder and cinnamon.

In a microwave safe bowl combine butter and chocolate. At 50% power microwave 30 seconds at a time stirring until it is smooth and melted.

In a medium mixing bowl, whisk sugar, eggs, and vanilla. Add melted chocolate and continue to stir until incorporated. Add the flour mixture and fold until combined.

Pour half of the batter into the 8x8 inch pan. Spread the pumpkin cream cheese evenly on top of the brownie batter. Drop remaining batter by spoonfuls on top of the cheesecake layer. Marble with a knife.

Bake for 35-40 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool for an hour before cutting.
