

American Endurance Ride Conference 2022 Old Pueblo Pioneer

On the weekend of March 18th – March 20th, a group of Ham Radio Operators gathered at the Empire Ranch airstrip for the 2022 Old Pueblo Pioneer AERC Endurance Ride. The location of the Empire Ranch airstrip falls between Vail & Sonoita Arizona.

The conference requests the professional help of the Ham Radio Operators to assist in emergency & tracking of the riders which could be up to a 50 mile ride from start to finish. The Ham Radio Operators are staged at various check points throughout the various courses as directed and dispatched by a central Net Control station located in the heart of what is known as Base Camp. Before any rider can be released to the courses (Loops), the horses must go through a Vet Check located at Base Camp. Once they (rider & horse) are cleared by Vet Check, they are released to the loop which is where many Hams are located as each and every rider must be accounted for since the loops can be quite long. Once a rider goes through a Check Point, the rider number is reported back to Net Control and the rider is accounted for. Net Control knows how many riders are expected through the Check Point and once all riders have passed the checkpoint, the Ham Radio Operator is released from the Check Point to be assigned to another Check Point or to return to Base Camp for some lunch and to Standby for another assignment later in the day.

Much Thanks to all the Hams that volunteer for this really cool event. Most Hams bring their campers out and participate the whole weekend. Others come for a day and help out. ALL are appreciated. The weather can be anywhere from sunshine to rain with mild temperatures to chilly nights. No riders after sundown, but relaxing at your campers at Base Camp, is relaxing.






Announcing the 7th Call Area QSO Party (7QP) will take place on May 7-8th 2022 starting at 1300 UTC (6:00A MST) on Saturday the 7th. The 7QP is an amateur radio contest, held annually on the first Saturday in May by the Central Oregon DX Club. The stations of the US 7th call area (Arizona, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming) become "the pursued", and the rest of the US, Canada, and the world tries to work as many



of us, on as many bands/modes as possible, over the 18-hour period. For the organizers of 7QP, a key objective is to get as many of the state's counties (15 Arizona counties) activated for at least some of the contest by promoting serious "roving" mobile operation and county-line stations, and the casual-operator at fixed stations in under-populated counties. Why not consider turning a camping trip into a ham expedition? There are many entry categories (more than most other contests) so there is something for everyone. Working this contest is far more rewarding from that remote location than an otherwise normal contest weekend at home. At this time, counties such as Cochise, Gila, Graham, La Paz and Navajo are still in need of activity and often soft in participation so they should be considered. Visit http://Tqp.org/new/Page.asp? Cooking up Some MagiC



Soy-Ginger Pot Roast

Ingredients

1 boneless beef chuck roast (3 to 4 pounds)

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon pepper

1 tablespoon canola oil

1-1/2 cups water

1/2 cup reduced-sodium soy sauce

1/4 cup honey

3 tablespoons cider vinegar

3 garlic cloves, minced

2 teaspoons ground ginger

1 teaspoon ground mustard

1 large onion, halved and sliced

2 tablespoons cornstarch

2 tablespoons cold water

Directions

- 1. Sprinkle roast with salt and pepper. In a large skillet, heat oil over mediumhigh heat. Brown roast on all sides. Transfer meat to a 5- or 6-qt. slow cooker. In a small bowl, mix water, soy sauce, honey, vinegar, garlic, ginger and mustard; pour over meat. Top with onion. Cook, covered, on low 7-9 hours, until meat is tender.
- 2. Remove roast and onion to a serving platter; keep warm. Transfer cooking juices to a large saucepan; skim fat. Bring cooking juices to a boil. In a small bowl, mix cornstarch and cold water until smooth; stir into cooking juices. Return to a boil; cook and stir until thickened, 1-2 minutes. Serve with roast.
