Some New Rules Going into Effect this Year for ARRL Field Day

(June 25 – 26)

After taking a few detours over the past couple of years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, ARRL Field Day rules are being updated on a permanent basis starting this summer. ARRL conducted a Field Day community survey with invitations propagated far and wide, and direct emails sent to more than 15,000 individuals and ARRL-affiliated clubs. After sorting through, reviewing, and discussing the survey results, the ARRL Programs and Services Committee recommended a number of rule changes for ARRL Field Day, which will take place this year over the June 25 – 26 weekend.

Starting this year, the maximum PEP output for a transmitter used by anyone submitting a Field Day log will be 100 W. The power multiplier of 2 will remain in place, and the high-power category will be removed from the rules. Until this year, the maximum low-power limit had been 150 W for most ARRL-sponsored operating events. The power multiplier will remain at 5 for QRP participants running a maximum of 5 W or less. As previously announced, 100 W is now the low-power category limit for all ARRL and IARU HF Contests, effective January 1, 2022.

A couple of changes instituted initially as accommodations for the COVID-19 pandemic will remain. Class D (Home) stations will continue to be able to earn points for contacts with other Class D stations. The club aggregate scoring change initiated in 2020 as a temporary measure will become part of the permanent rules. In the aggregate scoring plan, the scores of individual stations are combined under the score of a single club.

Another change, involving Rule 7.3.2 Media Publicity, has been modified. Rules to date have offered 100 bonus points for attempting to obtain publicity and demonstrating same. With the ease of posting via Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and various other media websites, Field Day participants will now be required to obtain publicity, not just try to do so. Any combination of bona fide media hits would qualify for the bonus points. For example, posting the details of your upcoming or ongoing Field Day activity, or your Field Day results, on a club or news media site, on Facebook, or via Twitter and Instagram would meet the bonus criteria. Photos and videos are encouraged as part of media posts.

A Little History On The Gals Night Net

She then bought a raffle ticket at the Hamfest she took her test at and WON the grand prize HF radio. She went thru the ranks and then earned her EXTRA CLASS ticket in 2016 ten years later. I, as her husband, never ever pushed her to get licensed. I never forced things like resistors, transistors or vacuum tubes on her. I wanted to make the hobby of Ham Radio fun for her (which is the key guys) and that's exactly what I did. Instead of constantly talking about electronic components and all that boring stuff, she wanted to figure out how to incorporate radio communications into the charities she supports. THAT became her interest in the hobby. And till this day, she heads up major events around the Tucson area and built up an excellent core team of her closest Ham Radio friends. Many of this core team (The Chosen Few) still works with her today. She encourages all Hams to become part of the Chosen Few.

Since N7EMB enjoys talking on the radio, she wanted other licensed female Hams to get on the air, too. And what better way, than to create a weekly net just for the ladies. So, every Monday evening at 7:30 pm, Arizona time, on the EAARS repeater system, the "Gals Night Net" takes to the airways. This net has now crossed over the 7 year mark and continues to go strong every week. This is an excellent way to get seasoned and newly licensed female Hams that may be a little shy, on the air without the pressure of electronic talk, how radios work, etc... (unless they want to). She just wants more women on the air and to become active in the hobby.

In 2020, she was named the Amateur Radio Council of Arizona's (ARCA) Ham of the Year for everything she has done for Ham Radio including all her communications work for charities, Gal's Night Net and Newsletter Editor for EAARS. A plaque she proudly displays on the wall. A Job well done!

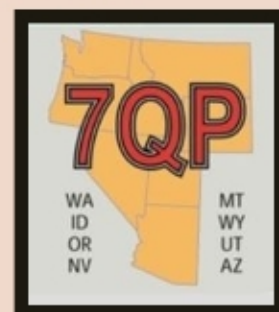

Announcing the 7th Call Area QSO Party (7QP) will take place on May 7-8th 2022 starting at 1300 UTC (6:00A MST) on Saturday the 7th. The 7QP is an amateur radio contest, held annually on the first Saturday in May by the Central Oregon DX Club. The stations of the US 7th call area (Arizona, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming) become "the pursued", and the rest of the US, Canada, and the world tries to work as many of us, on as many bands/modes as possible, over the 18-hour period. For the organizers of 7QP, a key objective is to get as many of the state's counties (15 Arizona counties) activated for at least some of the contest by promoting serious "roving" mobile operation and county-line stations, and the casual-operator at fixed stations in under-populated counties. Why not consider turning a camping trip into a ham expedition? There are many entry categories (more than most other contests) so there is something for everyone. Working this contest is far more rewarding from that remote location than an otherwise normal contest weekend at home. At this time, counties such as Cochise, Gila, Graham, La Paz and Navajo are still in need of activity and often soft in participation so they should be considered. 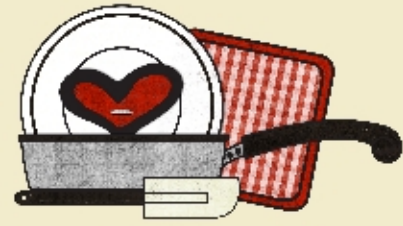

Cooking up

Egg Muffins



This egg muffins recipe makes the ideal healthy breakfast, lunch, or snack! Bake eggs in muffin tin cups, then refrigerate for quick meals.

Here's a customizable make-ahead recipe that works for healthy breakfast, lunch and snack: Egg Muffins! Bake up scrambled eggs in muffin tin cups with healthy veggies, then refrigerate them for meals all week! This works as a grab-and-go breakfast, and it's perfect for kid lunch boxes. We also find ourselves sneaking them out of the refrigerator for a quick snack. The filling is packed with good stuff: loads of spinach, cottage cheese for healthy protein, and jarred red pepper. They're easy to whip up and so full of flavor!

Ingredients

Eggs

Oregano, garlic powder, salt and pepper

Frozen spinach: don't substitute fresh; frozen spinach has a specific texture you'll want here

Cottage cheese: bold, savory flavor and velvety texture and adds protein

Parmesan cheese

Jarred roasted red peppers: substitute sundried tomatoes if desired

Bake it up in muffin cups

This egg muffins recipe is simple: whisk up the eggs, add the cheese and veggies, and bake it up! Head to the recipe below. But here are a few notes on the baking process:

Important: squeeze out as much water as possible from the spinach! The spinach should feel like dry crumbs when you are done. This makes sure the egg muffins will hold together when baking and won't be too watery.

Spray or grease the muffin tin well. You'll want to be able to pop the egg muffins right out after baking!

Bake until puffed and golden, 22 to 24 minutes.

They'll deflate a bit after you let them cool: that's expected!
