### PARADISE AMATEUR RADIO SPECIAL EVENT HOSTED BY THE COCHISE AMATEUR RADIO ASSOCIATION

Join CARA in Paradise, AZ, Sept 3 to Sept 5, 2022.

For 44 years, the Cochise Amateur Radio Association has hosted a Labor Day weekend Special Event station [K7RDG] in Paradise, AZ to make contacts via CW, SSB and PSK31 digital mode and now FT8/4.

Paradise is now a ghost town which was active when an ore vein was found at the turn of the century. Located near the New Mexico border, on the east side of the Chiricahua Mountains 5.7 miles east of Portal [31.934-109.218) in the Coronado National Forest.

Attendees have the choice of camping in their RVs or tents or stay in lodging in the vicinity. The beautiful meadow area is dry [no facilities, Porta-John is provided] with shaded areas and surrounded by trees and vistas of the mountain peaks. Activities are focused on communications; making contacts with your own or CARA provided HF and VHF equipment and antennas.

This event is also a RACES/ARES emergency communication training exercise, and we utilize the MCU [Mobile Communications Unit] to provide support. Additionally. hiking, sightseeing, exploring, evening campfires [if permitted], group meals and much more is in store.

A big Thank You to our EAARS President for his recent work with the EAARS interactive map. Dan – AF7EF has put a great deal of time updating the EAARS map at eaars.com. If you have not seen this map, you will certainly want to check this out. The map can be viewed by going to the EAARS website and click on the link titled EAARS NETWORK. The map will be displayed at the bottom of the page.

Since the map is interactive, you can click on various parts of the map for more details.

If you click on the blue or red lines, it will give you linking information. Red lines are microwave links and blue lines are 70cm RF backbone links.

By clicking on the blue site pointer, it will present you with information about the repeater site and each pointer is being populated with photos of the repeater site itself.

### Life before QRZ.com...

How in the world did the old timers look up callsigns to see where people lived and got their address? There was a book available that most hams called the Flying Horse Callbook.

They were very much like a phone book from a large city. I used to visit the library which had a copy in the reference books section. Problem was that the book was usually a year or two old. When computers came along the printed callbook sales really dropped and after 1997 the Flying Horse Callbook was no longer printed.

They remained in business with the callbook loaded on a CD rom. The CD's were very popular since in the early days of computing, many did not have internet service. I'll bet some of the older members can probably find an old QRZ CD in the closet.

There were several companies putting out callbook CD's and now with QRZ. com, I imagine there aren't many left. If someone still has an old Flying Horse Callbook, it would be an interesting thing for Show and Tell at a club meeting.



# Cooking up Some MagiC



### Pasta with 15-Miunute Burst Cherry Tomato Sauce



Ingredients - 4–6 servings 1 lb. pasta Kosher salt ½ cup olive oil 2 large garlic cloves, finely chopped 3 pints cherry tomatoes ½ tsp. freshly ground black pepper Pinch of sugar 1 cup coarsely chopped fresh basil Freshly grated Parmesan (for serving) Active Time: 15 minutes Total Time: 20 minutes This cherry tomato pasta recipe is perfect for a weeknight dinner—especially when time is short or it's too hot to stand over a stove for long. While it highlights summer flavors, this easy pasta dish is actually wonderful all year long. Good cherry and grape tomatoes are available year-round thanks to the fact that they ripen in less time than larger tomatoes and are also easy to grow in hothouses (and in warmer climates) in the winter. This recipe takes full advantage of their juicy sweetness and acidic pop.

While your pasta is cooking, you'll heat a little extra virgin olive oil in a large skillet and cook the tomatoes quickly over high heat with nothing more than a pinch of sugar, black pepper, and some garlic (if you'd like a little more heat, a bit of crushed red pepper flakes would also fit in well). By the time the noodles are done, the tomatoes will have softened and split, and their sweet-tart juices will have coalesced into a light pasta sauce. Reserve some of the starchy pasta water and add it to the skillet bit by bit to give the sauce a little more body, if you'd like.

Garnish with fresh basil leaves and Parmesan (ideally grated right over each serving with a convenient Microplane), and dinner is ready. In fact, the most timeconsuming part of the entire meal is waiting for the water to boil!

Step 1: Cook pasta in a large pot of boiling salted water, stirring occasionally, until al dente; drain pasta and transfer to a large bowl.

Step 2: Meanwhile, heat oil in a 12" skillet or wide heavy saucepan over medium-high. Add garlic, then tomatoes, pepper, sugar, and 1 tsp. salt. Cook, stirring occasionally, until tomatoes burst and release their juices to form a sauce, 6-8 minutes. kiss the

Step 3: Toss pasta with tomato sauce and basil. Top with Parmesan.
